If you can pay now

You'll find everything you need to pay online:

- Go to GOV.UK and search 'paying HMRC'.
- Select the tax type you need to pay and follow the step by step instructions please make sure you use the right reference for each type of tax.

You'll need your Government Gateway user ID and password. If you don't have an ID and password, you can create them as part of this process. You can also retrieve a forgotten user ID or password.

We're here to help you. Please phone us now on 0300 200 3819 to talk about it with one of our customer support advisers. They will work with you to explore payment options that you can afford – for instance, through a payment plan where you can pay it over time in instalments.
